



## **Aviation Concepts CareJet Air Ambulance**

### **OVERVIEW**

Established in 2007 to meet the growing demand for emergency medical evacuations from remote regions across the Pacific, CareJet now provides the residents and tourists of Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, Micronesia, Southeast Asia, and Northern Australia with emergency access to world-class medical care. Through a new partnership agreement with Malaysia-based CompuMed that green-lights CareJet patients for entry into 60 major hospitals and hundreds of specialty clinics, CareJet envisions a service area that spans the distance from Japan to New Zealand and from India to Hawaii.

From its base at the Antonio B. Won Pat International Airport in the U.S. Territory of Guam, CareJet's dedicated Westwind II twin-engine jet –along with its team of seasoned, U.S. FAA-trained-and-certified flight pilots and emergency flight medicine professionals– can transport patients to any receiving medical facility worldwide. Installed on board of the CareJet vessel is the air ambulance industry's highest-standard medical equipment and abundant medical supplies to ensure maximum care during patient transport. All patient transports are under the supervision of a U.S. board-certified Medical Director and Registered Nurses trained in Advanced Cardiac Life Support, Pediatric Advanced Life Support, Neonatal Advanced Life Support, Advanced Trauma Life Support (ATLS) and Obstetric Care – all with years of experience in Emergency Rooms and the Intensive Care Units.

### **MISSION**

CareJet's mission is to be always ready to get qualified patients to a higher level of care as quickly and safely as possible with a staff of certified and credentialed physicians, nurses, paramedics, medical technicians, pilots and other trained professionals. CareJet does this with a commitment to preserving the life, confidentiality and respect of every qualified patient. CareJet operates its jet aircraft with the same life support devices found in any modern-day

intensive care unit, so each CareJet patient is as stabilized as possible in transit to a qualified, recommended receiving hospital.

### **CAPABILITIES & SERVICE**

CareJet operates an Emergency Operations Center, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. With dispatchers trained in international aircraft scheduling, patients can rest assured that the necessary permits, visas, and flight authorizations are secured promptly and efficiently. All communication amongst the patient's physician, insurance providers, and the receiving facility is coordinated and tracked by the dispatcher-schedulers on duty.

To ensure a seamless transfer between the patient's point of origin and the receiving hospital, CareJet partners with licensed and reputable ground ambulance services and helicopter operators that are experienced with its protocols and handling procedures.

With its aircraft dedicated for air ambulance use, CareJet can reach Manila, Philippines in 3.3 hours, Tokyo, Japan in 3.4 hours, Hong Kong in 4.4 hours, Cairns, Australia in 4.9 hours, Shanghai, China in 5.0 hours, and Bali, Indonesia in 5.5 hours.

## **MEMBERSHIP PROGRAM**

By joining CareJet's membership program, residents and tourists on the island of Guam can secure guaranteed air medical evacuation in emergency situations, at no cost to themselves. For a minimum annual fee, members will receive a card confirming their enrollment as well as a policy outlining their benefit entitlement. CareJet's medical director, in consultation with the patient's physician, will determine transport eligibility based on the patient's medical condition. Eligible members are flown to world-class facilities in Japan, the Philippines, or other metropolitan centers with critical care, according to their preference.

CareJet also works with the Government of Guam and major health insurance providers to help "qualified" Guam residents to secure CareJet's services.

## **MEDICAL TEAM & FLIGHT CREW**

With a medical crew fluent in English, Japanese and Tagalog, CareJet aims to meet its patients' every need. A U.S. board-certified surgeon serves as Medical Director for the air ambulance service and is supported by a team of highly skilled Registered Nurses. The medical team has extensive experience providing advanced life support in hospital Emergency Rooms and Intensive Care Units. A medical doctor can be present aboard any air ambulance flight if deemed necessary. Flight nurses may also administer medication to the patient as directed by the air ambulance Medical Director.

CareJet's flight crew members are veteran pilots operating under the U.S. Federal Aviation Regulations Part-135 certificate of Aviation Concepts Inc., which has worldwide flying authority. All pilots undergo recurrent training as mandated by the U.S. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) in addition to completing in-house training on international procedures.

## **FLEET PROFILE & MEDICAL EQUIPMENT**

CareJet owns and operates a Westwind II exclusively for air ambulance use. This twin-engine, highly successful business jet is ideal for patient transport as its body is low to the ground and allows for easy access from the runway. The aircraft is equipped for extended range and features fuel-efficient turbofan engines. The Westwind II can accommodate one patient, a two-person flight crew, a two-person medical crew, and an accompanying passenger.

In-house teams of FAA-certified Airframe & Power Plant aircraft

mechanics oversee the maintenance of CareJet's Westwind II and ensure that the aircraft is safe and in excellent condition at all times. Maintenance is conducted in CareJet's 50,000-square-foot operations center, which features direct access to A.B. Won Pat Guam International Airport's restricted Air Operations Area. CareJet meets and exceeds safety standards set forth by the U.S. Federal Aviation Administration and utilizes the highest standard of medical equipment to ensure that the patient is well cared for while in-flight.
